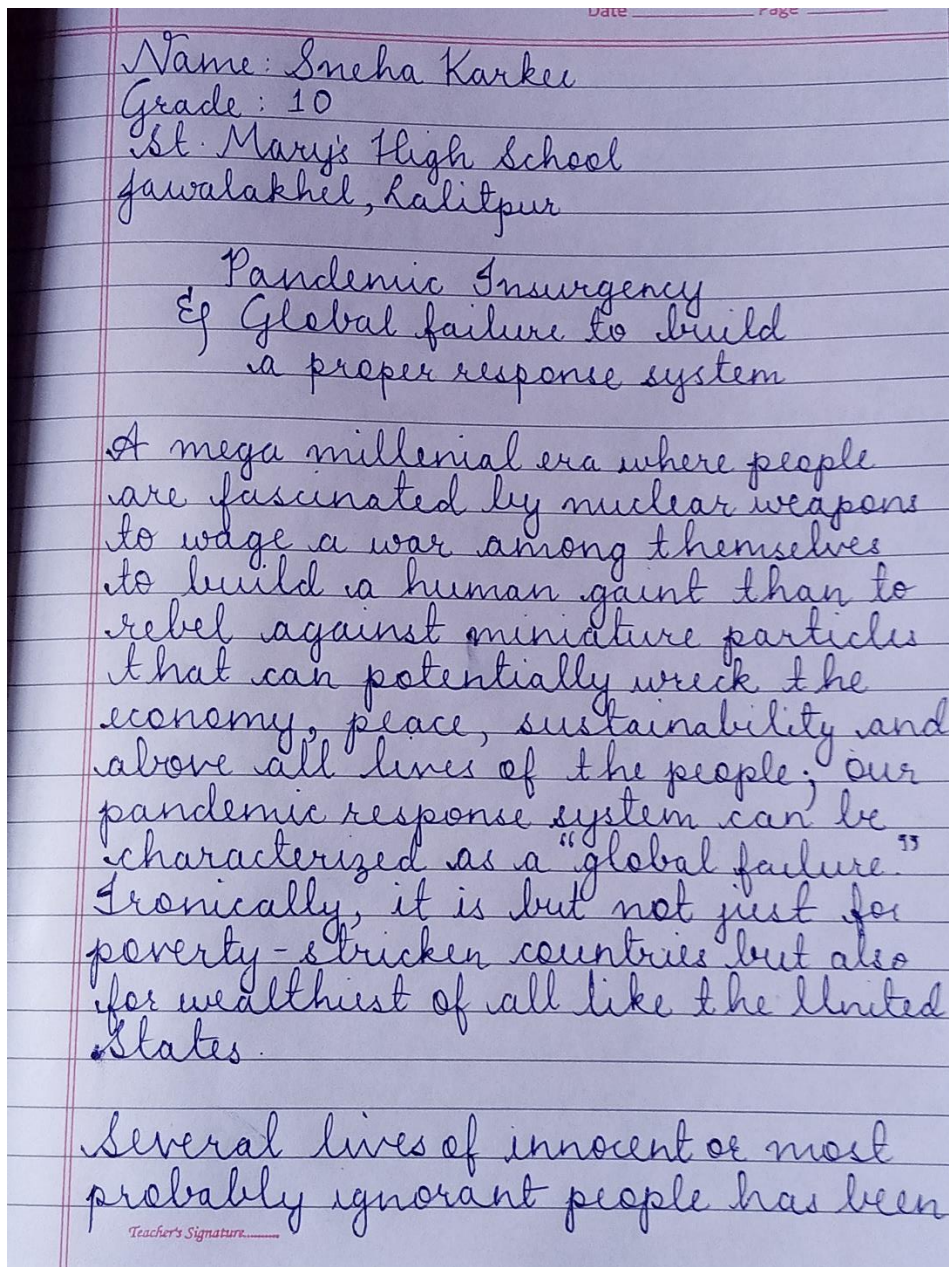

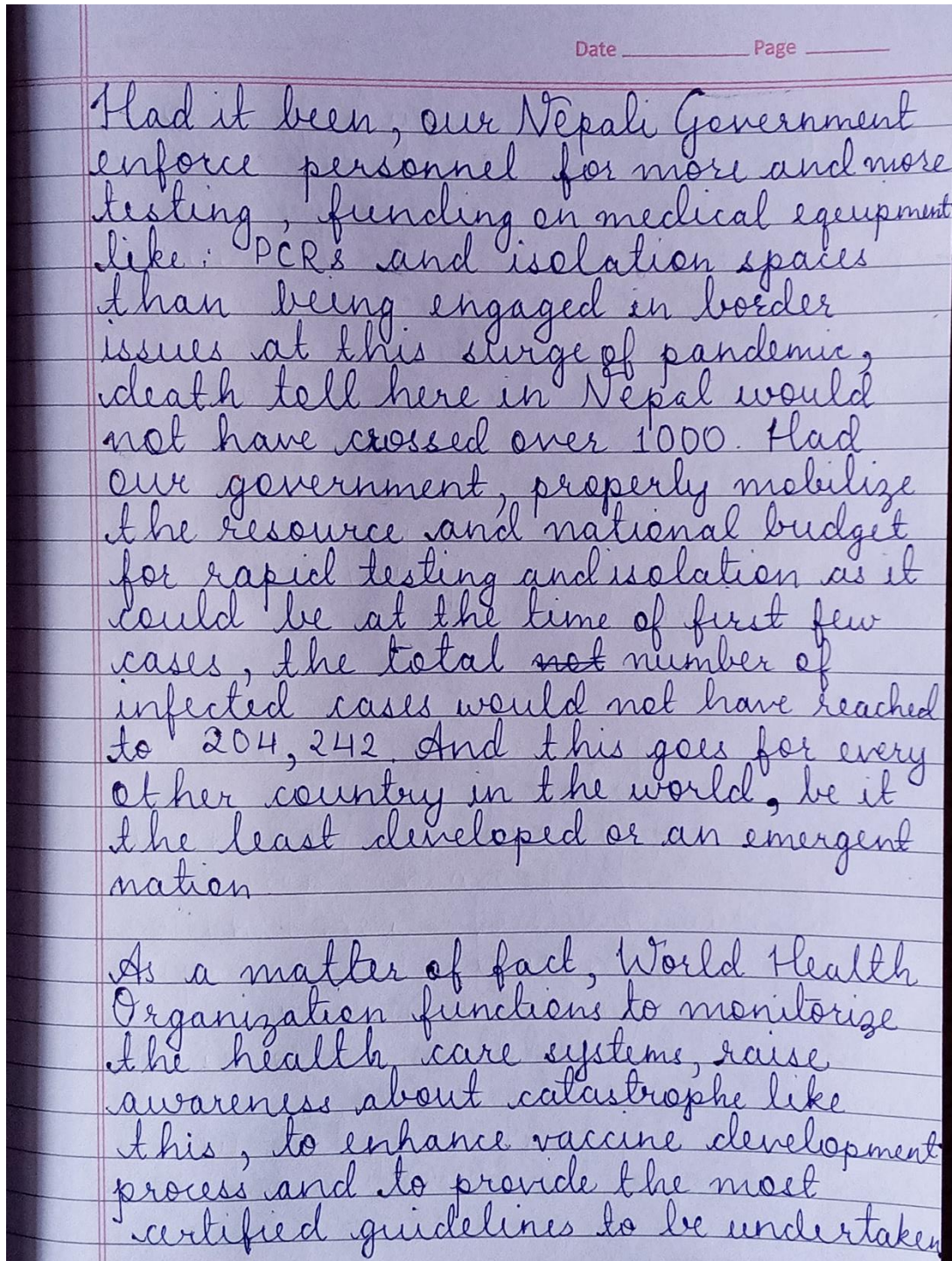
PANDEMIC INSURGENCY and GLOBAL FAILURE to BUILD a PROPER RESPONSE SYSTEM
